
West Lafayette has been designated a Tree City USA for 27 years by the Arbor Day Foundation.

## **BLUE SPRUCES ARE AT RISK**

Colorado blue spruces are a favorite in landscaping because of their beautiful color and shape. However, many such spruces in



Indiana are getting sick and dying because the climate and soils in Indiana are very different from their native habitat. This disease, known as needle cast disease is a fungal condition that results in the shedding of



needles. Coniferous, or cone-bearing trees, are then at great risk because they cannot produce a second growth of needles after their initial spring growth.
